

Up From Slavery

This is the untold story of slavery as it existed in the North, New York and Long Island in particular. Starting with the Dutch West India Company and New Amsterdam in 1627, and continuing with the English and New York in 1664, it is the story of our colonial time and the American Revolution right up to July 4, 1827 and Manumission Day and the official end of slavery in New York...the last northern state to end that institution. Through a series of lectures and field trips, the teachers will visit lower Manhattan and the African Burial Ground, travel to Phillipsburg Manor in Westchester and have a lunch in Huntington prepared by a chef with African, Caribbean and Southern influences. Carpooling and transportation will be set up at the first class and admission fees of \$45 will be collected at that time.
